

Arizona's Future Promise Plan

Arizona's Future Promise offers scholarships to Arizona high school graduates pursuing two year degrees, postsecondary certificates, or bachelor's degrees. The program provides eligible students a last-dollar scholarship to pay tuition not covered by the Pell grant. In the case of community college and certificate program students, the aid will extend beyond tuition to pay for fees and books. Students will be assigned a mentor from a partnering agency and aid is contingent upon participation. Non-traditional, adult learners returning for degree reclamation will have the opportunity to attend community college tuition-free.

Eligibility

- Be an Arizona resident
- Graduate from an Arizona high school, obtain a GED, or complete an Arizona home school program
- Apply to and enroll in an accredited Arizona community college or university
- Maintain a minimum 2.5 GPA
- Complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) and Arizona Future Promise Plan application

Award Amounts

Four-year institutions: up to \$5,000 per year for a maximum of 6,000 students per cohort

Two-year institutions and other programs: up to \$2,500 per year for a maximum of 4,000 students per cohort

Non-traditional students: up to \$2,500 per year for a maximum of 3,000 students per cohort at two-year institutions

Cost

Arizona's Future Promise will enroll up to 10,000 eligible new students each year until the full capacity of 40,000 students is achieved. The estimated cost is projected to be \$2000M per year when fully operational.
